Dr. Robert Hoesch was born and raised in Baltimore, Maryland. Dr. Hoesch attended the University of Maryland, College Park where he received his bachelor's degree in cell and molecular biology and genetics. He then attended the University of Maryland, School of Medicine where he earned his MD and a PhD in Cellular Neurophysiology.
